# WELCOME to our Journey to Longbranch!

In the late 1880s, The Winchester-Petersen logging company initially established floating logging camps in Filucy Bay to house the loggers as they practiced shoreline logging. As the trees near the edge of the water were logged out, the floating camps were moved to where there was more timber. The married employees acquired the logged off lands and were eventually able to farm and raise families. These became our first pioneers of the south end of the Peninsula. Transportation was poor, and the many foot trails were hard to follow or ended up going nowhere. The skid roads left behind by the logging operations were often impassable during the long rainy months. The Sound's adjoining waterways were the only way to get in and out of this remote area. For many years, travel by canoe, rowboat, a small sailboat, steamer or launch were the only means of travel.

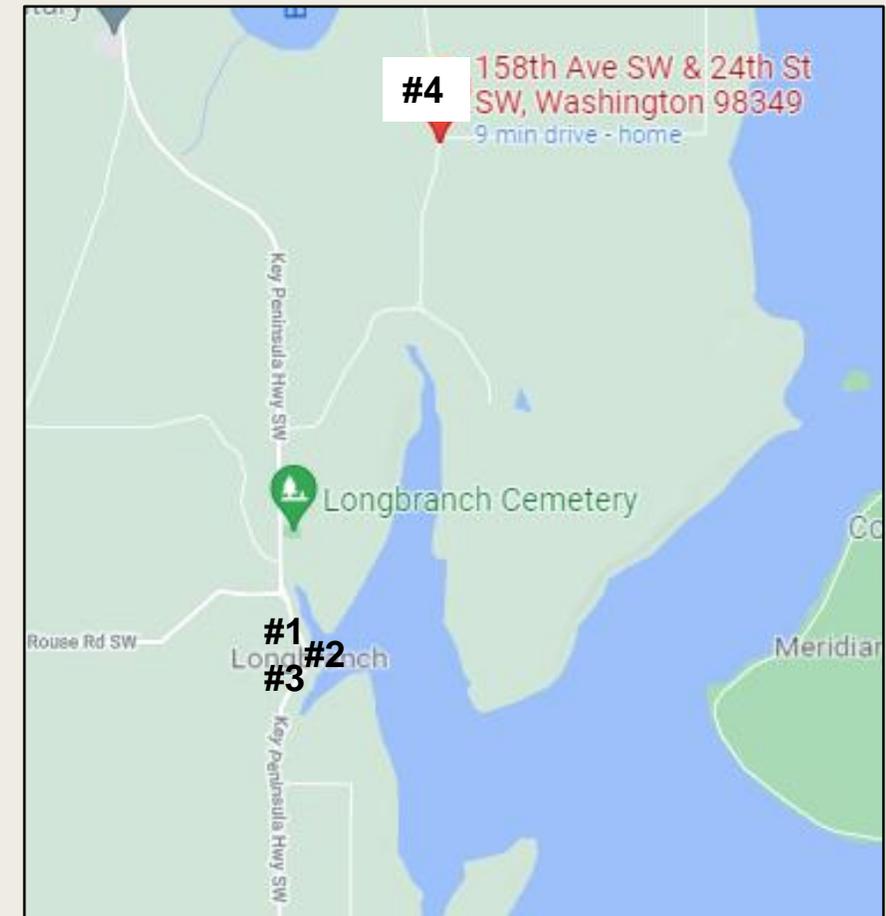
In 1889, Edward Yeazell wanted to duplicate the Long Branch resort on the Atlantic Coast. Although his plan failed, Longbranch received its name, though eventually the name was changed to a single word by the post office in 1894 to avoid delivery confusion with the nearby Long Beach.

# #1. LONGBRANCH IMPROVEMENT CLUB

## Longbranch Improvement Club

The Longbranch Improvement Club was incorporated on December 10, 1921, close to one hundred years ago. This was before paved roads had arrived in Longbranch. The original stated purpose was to “purchase real estate for recreation and for a consolidated school.” The large school gymnasium, built by the Works Progress Administration is now the main hall of the Longbranch Improvement Club. There are presently no school activities taking place in the facility. The Improvement Club was placed on the National Register of Historic Places on September 28, 1987. This magnificent facility has been used for many years as the central gathering place for dances, weddings, memorial services, bazaars, swap meets, formal presentations and gatherings of almost any kind. The acreage that accompanies the improvement center has been the site of many logging events, baseball games, street fair type of events and carnivals for many years.

The main room has a capacity of three hundred people and is 60 x 63 feet. At one end there is a raised stage, complete with lighting for a theater. In addition to the main hall is a 37' x 30' meeting room that will accommodate fifty people nicely, along with a kitchen that is adequate for refreshments and banquet services. It is available to rent for most local organizations and individuals. Membership in the Longbranch Improvement Club is not a requirement to rent this facility.

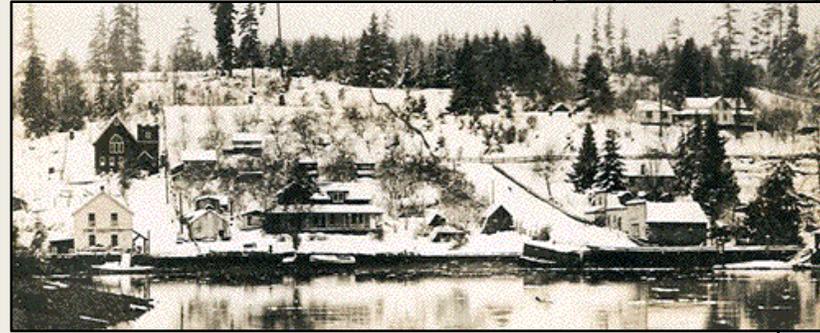
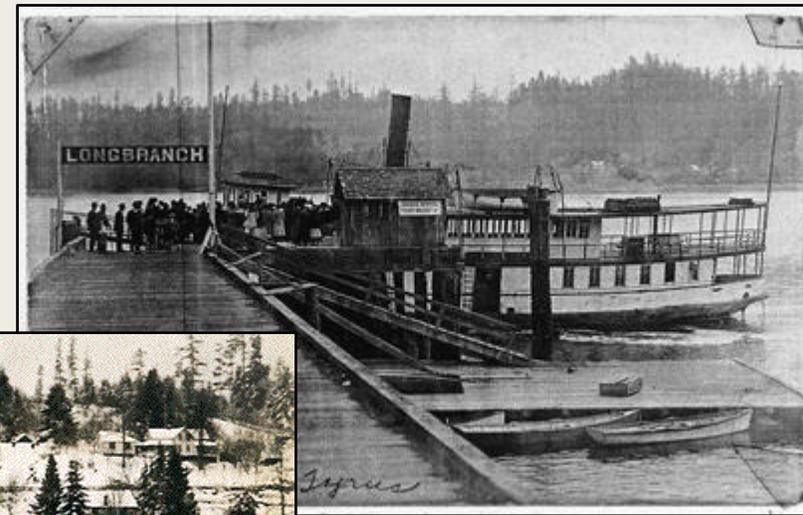


## #2. LONGBRANCH MARINA

The hub of what was at one time the center of the City of Longbranch is the Longbranch Marina on Filucy Bay. The first wharf was constructed here in 1885. This wharf at one time brought in supplies from the other ports on Puget Sound, or the Salish Sea, as it was once called. At one time the Mosquito Fleet docked their ferries here to supply the Longbranch area of the Key Peninsula. The dock area contained a post office (1890), two stores (1886 and 1893), a fruit farmer's cooperative store (moved here in 1907 and collapsed into the water in 1928), a community church (built in 1908, condemned in 1934) and a hotel (built in 1889 and moved to avoid subsidence in 1934). This was the true and historic center making up the city of Longbranch.

This present marina is owned by the Longbranch Improvement Club and operates under an Aquatic Lands Lease from the State of Washington Department of Natural Resources. Local boat owners can enjoy year-round moorage for forty-five boats from 22 to 40 feet in length. In addition, there is seven hundred feet of moorage available for temporary recreational boaters.

The marina is open to the public during normal business hours of the day and visitors may walk down the dock and enjoy the water and view the boating activity.

# #3. OLD GERMAN LUTHERN CEMETERY

Old German Church



The German Lutheran Church is off the beaten path in Longbranch and is known by few. It is located at the intersection of 158<sup>th</sup> Avenue SW and 24<sup>th</sup> Street SW. All that is apparent these days from the road is a few tombstones, as many of them are now in the lower, or older, part of the cemetery on this eight-acre parcel of land. Many of the Longbranch and Key Peninsula pioneers are buried in the lower “pioneer” section that is not visible from the road. Entrance may be gained to the cemetery, with permission, by requesting permission according to the directions posted on the admission gate. This cemetery was originally the site of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Holy Trinity that was founded in 1889. Construction of the church was completed in 1890. Early records indicate that the cost of the church was \$769.05. As founding Treasurer, Henry Mahncke was elected to be the fund raiser for this initial effort to build the church. The size of the church was 24’ x 40’.

Since the early parishioners of this church were new to America and unfamiliar with the English language, the early church records were written entirely in German until in 1905, when English words started appearing.
